ORDER FOR SUBPOENA DUCES TECUM

This day, upon application of the plaintiff, and for good cause shown,

IT IS ORDERED BY THE COURT that the Clerk issue a subpoena duces tecum for John H. Fultz and William H. Daugherty, respectively Chief of Police and Mayor of Wellsville, Columbiana County, Ohio, requiring them to be and appear before the United States Grand Jury, on the third floor of the Federal Building at Ninth and Grand Avenue, in Kansas City, Missouri, forthwith as witnesses before said Grand Jury, and that they be required to bring with them and produce before said Grand Jury the following:

A .45 Colt's automatic pistol of the United States Army type of an unknown serial number which was used by one Adam Richetti, for the purpose of resisting arrest, and for the purpose of assaulting one John H. Fultz in a gun battle engaged in by John H. Fultz, Chief of Police, Wellsville, Columbiana County, Ohio, Adam Richetti and Charles Arthur Floyd, alias Pretty Boy Floyd, and a citizen, and which at the termination of said gun battle and immediately prior to the capture of Adam Richetti was by Adam Richetti dropped to the earth and taken into the custody and possession of John H. Fultz and/or Wm. H. Daugherty, respectively Chief of Police and Mayor of Wellsville, Columbiana County, Ohio and is now in the possession of said John H. Fultz, and/or Wm. H. Daugherty, at Wellsville, Columbiana County, Ohio.

A Thompson submachine gun either a 1921 or 1928 model, the exact model year of which is not precisely known, which on the 20th or 21st day of October, 1934, in Columbiana County, Ohio, one Charles Arthur Floyd, alias Pretty Boy Floyd, used for the purpose of resisting his own capture, and for the purpose of effecting the escape of Adam Richetti, and for the purpose of assaulting John H. Fultz, and which at the termination of said gun battle and immediately prior to his escape, or at an approximate time, Charles Arthur Floyd, alias Pretty Boy Floyd, dropped to the earth at a point at or near the scene of the gun battle aforesaid and which said Thompson sub-machine gun was thereupon taken into the custody and possession of John H. Fultz, and/or Wm. H. Daugherty, respectively Chief of Police and Mayor of Wellsville, Columbiana County, Ohio and is now in the possession of the said John H. Fultz and/or Wm. H. Daugherty, in Wellsville, Columbiana County, Ohio.

All shells, drums, clips and other equipment picked up and taken into the possession and custody of John H. Fultz, and/or his agents and deputies used or intended for use in the above Thompson sub-machine gun, and said .45 Colt's automatic pistol which said shells, drums, clips and other equipment are now in the possession and custody of the said John H. Fultz, and/or Wm. H. Daugherty, respectively Chief of Police and Mayor of Wellsville, Columbiana County, Ohio.

In regard to alleged violations of the statutes of the United States of America by Adam Richetti, Richard Tallman Galatas, et al.
