As Bernard Phillips, No. C-26406, arrested police department, Chicago, Illinois, November 22, 1930; charge, general principles.

Bernard Phillips is wanted in connection with the murder of Otto Reed, Chief of Police of McAlester, Oklahoma, William J. Grooms and Frank E. Bermanson, police officers of Kansas City, Missouri, Raymond J. Caffrey, Special Agent of the United States Bureau of Investigation, and their prisoner, Frank Nash, at Kansas City, Missouri, on June 17, 1933.
