VANDEYENTER, United States Attorney, also comes the defendant in his own proper person, and upon being arraigned for plea says he is guilty of conspiracy to violate the National Prohibition Act as charged in first count of Indictment herein; The United States Attorney enters nolle prosequi to counts 2, 3, thereupon the United States Attorney having moved for sentence, and the defendant being called upon to state reasons, if any he has, why sentence should not now be pronounced upon him, and none being stated, and the Court being fully advised in the premises, it is ordered that the punishment of the said JOSEPH PISCITTA be fixed at imprisonment in the United States Industrial Reformatory at Chillicothe, Ohio, for a period of One (1) Year and One (1) Day and a fine of \$250.00 and that he stand committed to said Reformatory until said fine is paid, or until released by due process of law, without costs.

It is further ordered that the United States Marshal for this District take and deliver the body of him, the said JOSEPH PISCITTA into the custody of the Superintendent of the United States Industrial Reformatory at Chillicothe, Ohio, for safe keeping for a period of One year and one day from this date.

It is further ordered that the Clerk of this Court make a certified copy of the judgment and sentence herein, together with a writ of commitment in due form and deliver the same to the Marshal for execution. Commitment issued accordingly.
