SEARCH WARRANT UNDER THE NATIONAL PROHIBITION ACT

To Internal Revenue Officer of the United States for the Western District of Missouri and to his deputies, or any of them, and to B. F. Beazell, Federal Prohibition Agent and to his deputies, or any of them:

Whereas, complaint on oath and in writing, supported by affidavit, has this day been made before me George D. Beardsley a United States Commissioner for the said District, by B. F. Beazell alleging that the laws of the United States, namely, the National Prohibition Act, 41 Statutes at large, page 307 and following pages, have been and are being unlawfully violated in this, to-wit:

That intoxicating liquor has been and is now being illegally, kept, bartered and sold, in the pool hall and soft drink parlor located at 100 Delaware, or corner of Delaware and West 5th Street, said building being described as a three story brick building with basement, and said intoxicating liquor being concealed within said premises and on the persons of those who are connected with and operating said place of business.

being the premises of John Doe (true name unknown) and being situated at No. 100 Delaware, Street, in the City of Kansas City, County of Jackson, and State of Missouri and within the District above named:

You are therefore hereby commanded in the name of the President of the United States, to enter said premises in the day time or the night time, with the necessary and proper assistance and there diligently to investigate and search into and concerning said violations, and to report and act concerning the same as required of you by law.
