Hogg, Federal Prohibition Agent, which is hereto attached and marked "Exhibit A", informs the Court and gives the Court to understand that on or about the 2nd day of April, 1925, at Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri, in the Western Division of the Western District of Missouri, and within the jurisdiction of this Court, one

then and there being, did then and there unlawfully and wilfully, and in violation of the National Prohibition Act

SELL for beverage purposes

a certain quantity of intoxicating liquor, to-wit:

One quart of wine

contrary to the form of the statute in such cases made and provided, and against the peace and dignity of the United States of America.

SECOND COUNT.

And the said H.L. Donnelly Assistant United States Attorney for the Western District of Missouri, as aforesaid, in the manner and form aforesaid, also informs the Court and gives the Court to understand that on or about the 4th day of April, 1925, at Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri, in the Western Division of the Western District of Missouri and within the jurisdiction of this Court, one

then and there being, did then and there unlawfully and wilfully and in violation of the National

Prohibition Act,

Possess for beverage purposes

a certain quantity or intoxicating liquor, to-wit:

Twenty-five gallons of wine

contrary to the form of the statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace and dignity of the United States of America.

THIRD COUNT.

And the said H.L. Donnelly, Assistant United States Attorney for the Western District of Missouri, as aforesaid, in the manner and form aforesaid, also informs the Court and gives the Court to understand, that on or about the 1st day of January 1925, thence hitherto, in the Western Division of the Western District of Missouri, and within the Jurisdiction of this Court, one

unlawfully, wilfully and knowingly did maintain a common nuisance at, in and upon the room, house, building and place, more particularly described and designated as follows:

1030 East Fifth Street in Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri,

where intoxicating liquors, to-wit, beer, wine and whiskey containing more than one-half of one per cent of alcohol by volume, and fit for use for beverage purposes was Kept, possessed, stored and sold in violation of Title II of the National Prohibition Act, contrary to the form of the Statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace and dignity of the United States of America.
