ORDER OF PROBATION.

Now on this day it appearing to the court that Joe DiGovanna entered a plea of guilty to crime committing internal Rev Act the crime of possessing a 75 gallon whiskey still, set up, not registered with internal Rev. collector & internal Rev. Dist. and it further appearing to the court that the ends of justice and the best interests of the public as well as the defendant will be subserved by placing said defendant on probation, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the said Joe DiGovanna, be, and he is hereby, placed upon probation for a period of two year, provided that the said Joe DiGovanna, together with two sureties shall furnish a good and sufficient bond in the sum of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) and no/100 . . DOLLARS, (\$1,000.00), conditioned upon the faithful observance of each and every condition of the probation order herein made.

It further appearing to the court that Doctor Max Goldman, is a suitable person to serve as special probation officer, IT IS ORDERED that he be and he is hereby appointed to act as such, without compensation,

and that he submit a true report, in writing, to this court at each and every regular term thereof, during said probationary period concerning the conduct and condition of the said probationer; and should any probationer violate any law of the United States or of any State thereof, or in any way conduct himself other than as a good citizen it shall be the duty of said special probation officer to immediately report such fact or facts to the court or to the judge thereof in vacation.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Special Probation Officer furnish said probationer with a written statement of the conditions of this probation and instruct him regarding the same.

AND IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that a certified Copy of this order be furnished to said Special Probation Officer.
