Harold Lane, Federal Prohibition Agent, which is hereto attached and marked "Exhibit A", informs the Court that on the 9th day of January 1929, at No. 516 Harrison Street, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri, in the Western Division of the Western District of Missouri, and within the jurisdiction of this court, one Sara Pallino and one Joseph DiGiovanna, then and there being, did then and there unlawfully and wilfully, and in violation of the National Prohibition Act sell for beverage purposes a certain quantity of intoxicating liquor, to-wit: one quart of whiskey, Contrary to the form of the statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace and dignity of the United States of America.

COUNT II.

And the said Harry L. Thomas, Assistant United States Attorney for the Western District of Missouri, as aforesaid, in the manner and form aforesaid, also informs the Court that on the 9th day of January, 1929, at No. 516 Harrison Street, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri, in the Western Division of the Western District of Missouri and within the jurisdiction of this Court, one Sam Pallino and one Joseph Digiovanna, then and there being, did then and there unlawfully and wilfully and in violation of the National Prohibition Act sell for beverage purposes a certain quantity of intoxicating liquor, to-wit: one quart of whiskey, contrary to the form of the statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace and dignity of the United States of America.

And the said Harry L. unlawfully and wilfully and in violation of the National Prohibition Act sell for beverage purposes a certain quantity of intoxicating liquor, to-wit: one quart of whiskey, contrary to the form of the statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace and dignity of the United States of America.

COUNT IV.

And the said Harry L. Thomas Assistant United States Attorney for the Western District of Missouri, as aforesaid, in the manner and form aforesaid, also informs the Court that on the 10th day of January 1929, at No. 516 Harrison Street, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri, Missouri, in the Western Division of the Western District of Missouri and within the jurisdiction of this Court, one Sam Pallino and one Joseph DiGiovanna then and there being, did then and there unlawfully and wilfully and in violation of the National Prohibition Act possess for beverage purposes a certain quantity of intoxicating liquor, to-wit: one hundred ninety-two (192) pints and eighty (80) quarts of whiskey, contrary to the form of the statute in such case made and provided, and against the peace and dignity of the United States of America.
