

BE IT REMEMBERED that on the 3rd day of the regular January Term, 1922, of the Circuit Court of Jackson County, Missouri, at Kansas City, the same being the day of February 1922, the following proceedings were had and made of record before Hon. Allen C. Southern, Judge of Division No. 5 in the cause entitled:

State of Missouri, Ex. Rel, Cameron L. Orr, Prosecuting Attorney of Jackson county, Missouri, Plaintiff, vs. Leannah Kearns, alias Annie Chambers, Defendant. No. 158785.

This cause having been heretofore heard and by the court taken under advisement on the 24th day of February 1922 and now the Court being fully advised in the premises doth find the issues in favor of the plaintiff and against the defendant and that the defendant was on June 27th 1921 and long prior thereto the owner in fee simple and in the possession of the following described real estate located and situated in Kansas City, Jackson County Missouri; to-wit;

"All of that certain tract of ground beginning at the point of intersection of the west line of Wyandotte street with the south line of Third street in Kansas City Missouri; and running thence west on the south line of said Third Street forty-five (45) feet to a point in said line; thence south and parallel with the west line of Wyandotte Street eighty-five (85) feet to a point; thence East forty-five (45) feet to a point on the West line of Wyandotte Street, thence north on the West line of Wyandotte Street to the aforesaid intersection and place of beginning, being a part of Lots 225 and 226, Block 23, Old Town Addition to Kansas City Missouri."

that there was at all of said time located on said property a two-story building, divided into rooms used, occupied, furnished and equipped as bedrooms, dance halls, reception halls, dining room as described in the first amended petition filed herein; that defendant had on said June 27th 1921 and long prior thereto unlawfully established, kept, permitted and maintained on said premises in Kansas City, Jackson county Missouri, a bawdy house, assignation house and place of prostitution; that said defendant was on said date using said premises and property and the furniture and equipment therein for the purpose of keeping and harboring lewd, immoral and lascivious women therein and permitted and required said women so harbored therein to receive and entertain men in the rooms of said house and building for the purpose of unlawful sexual intercourse, assignation, prostitution and for other immoral purposes and conduct; that said defendant was on said date guilty of establishing, keeping, permitting and maintaining a nuisance on said above described premises in Kansas City, Jackson county, Missouri and that said buildings, erections, rooms, places and the aforesaid bawdy house, assignation house and place of prostitution was established, kept, conducted, permitted, carried on, maintained and continued as aforesaid are nuisances and should be enjoined and abated as prayed for in plaintiff's first amended petition.

It is therefore by the court ordered, adjudged and decreed that the defendant, Leannah Kearns, alias Annie Chambers on the 27th day of June 1921 was guilty of a nuisance and of maintaining a nuisance on the above described premises; that the buildings, sheds and all of the rooms in said buildings and sheds, furniture, equipment and the grounds hereinabove described are a nuisance; that the defendant, her agents, tenants, grantees, lessees, licensee and all persons in possession or claiming possession of said buildings, premises and grounds, by or under said defendant and all of her attorneys, servants and employes and each of thembe and they are hereby forever enjoined and restrained from directly or indirectly establishing, maintaining, conducting, keeping or operating upon said premises a bawdy house, assignation

house or place of prostitution therein or thereon and from using said premises or any part thereof for the purpose of a bawdy house, assignation house, or place of restitution and that they be and they are hereby forever restrained from having keeping, harboring or permitting women or girls of lewd, lascivious and immoral character therein or thereon for any purpose or purposes whatsoever; that all houses, buildings, sheds and improvements located on said above described real estate and the premises described in the amended petition filed herein be closed from 12 o'clock noon on March 13th 1922 until 12 o'clock noon on May 13th 1922 and that the Sheriff of Jackson County, Missouri, be and he is hereby directed to close and keep closed and securely lock all doors and entrances to said premises and buildings and for that purpose he shall provide suitable locks for locking all gates, doors and entrances leading to said premises and the doors and entrances to the buildings and improvements located on the above described premises, and that defendant, her agents, attorneys, servants and employes and each of them are hereby restrained and enjoined from entering upon said premises or taking possession thereof, or using them or any part thereof, or conducting any business thereon or therein of any kind or character whatsoever from March 13th 1922 to May 13th 1922, provided, however, that permission is hereby given William E. Lyons, President of the Allen Investment Company or his duly authorized representative, to go upon said premises to examine the same for the purpose of the reasonable care thereof during said period of time or for the purpose of exhibiting or showing said property to prospective purchasers or lessees and the sheriff of Jackson County is hereby permitted to let him or his representatives have access to said premises and buildings for said purposes, but the said William E. Lyons nor his duly authorized representative shall not be permitted to have possession of said property or be permitted to go upon said premises or use the same for any other purpose whatsoever.

The court hereby retains jurisdiction of this cause for all further orders, judgments and decrees or any modification hereof that may be required; that the plaintiff have and recover of defendant its costs herein taxed in the sum of Thirty Two and 50/100 Dollars and that execution issue therefor.

On the 47th day of the regular January Term 1922, the same being the 4th day of March 1922, the following further proceedings were had and made of record, to-wit: State of Missouri, ex rel, Cameron L. Orr, Prosecuting Attorney of Jackson County, Missouri, Plaintiff, vs. Leannah Kearns, Defendant. No. 158785.

Now on this day comes defendant by attorney and presents to the court and files motion for a new trial of this cause. Defendant also files motion in arrest of the judgment entered herein.

Now defendant's said motion for a new trial of this cause is by the Court overruled; to which action and ruling of the court defendant excepts.

How defendant's said motion in arrest of the judgment entered herein is by the Court overruled; to which ruling of the Court defendant excepts .

Now defendant presents to the court and files application and affidavit for appeal from the decision and judgment of this court in this cause to the Supreme Court of Missouri; which said application is by the court sustained and appeal allowed to the supreme court of Missouri.

How the appeal bond herein is by the court fixed in the penal sum of Five Hundred Dollars and defendant given until on or before the tenth day after the expiration of the January Term 1922 of this court to file said bond and defendant given until on or before the last day of the

May Term 1922 of this Court to file her bill of exceptions herein.
