PETITION ON ACCOUNT.

Comes now the plaintiff and states that it is a corporation duly organized and existing under
and by virtue of the laws of Missouri, maintaining its principal office in Kansas City,
Jackson County, Missouri.

Plaintiff for its cause of action against the defendants and each of them states that said
defendants and each of them are indebted to the plaintiff upon one, general continuous,
running, open account in the sum of \$136.08 for advertising published and circulated at the
request of the defendants and each of them in the Kansas City Star and Kansas City Times,
newspapers owned, edited and circulated by this plaintiff, for the month of May, 1934, such
advertising appearing in said papers on May 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 12. Want as of March 12, 1935

Plaintiff states further that the charge for said advertising is Just and reasonable and the
usual charge for such advertising, and that repeated demand has been made upon defendants
and each of them for payment of said account that the same remains wholly unpaid. An
itemized statement of said account is hereto attached, marked Exhibit "A", and made a part
hereof as if fully set out herein.

WHEREFORE, plaintiff prays judgment against the defendants and each of them in the sum
of One Hundred Thirty-Six and 00/100ths \$150.96 Dollars, and for its costs herein incurred.
