Subject is white, 50 years of age and serving a sentence of three years from the Western District of Missouri; Kansas City, for violation of the Narcotic Act (Sale, concealment and facilitating Sale) Prosecuting Agency Report and United States Attorney's Report indicates no additional criminal record. United States Immigration and Naturalization Service, Dallas, Texas, have advised subject is not wanted for deportation. Subject will be eligible for parole consideration on March 26, 1944 and is not wanted.

1.    CUSTODY

Subject has received no conduct reports while at this institution and has made a good institutional adjustment. He has been assigned to the culinary continuously since since being released from quarantine. He is rated as a good worker, is trustworthy, friendly pleasant, energetic and faithful.

Detail officer states: "Subject has made progress in his work." He has a satisfactory attitude at present.

2.    SOCIAL

7-3-43 A report received from the Provident Family and Children's Service, Kansas City, Missouri, in response to our request concerning subject for verification and application of social history. Subject's wife was contacted and states that subject has been a good worker and earned a substantial income ever since she knew him. The wife expressed a deep desire to re-unite with subject when he is released, as he has always been a kind and thoughtful person. The investigator reports that subject's wife is a woman of charm and grace that would inspire respect in a husband. The wife feels that subject is not guilty of the current offense and said that subject had borrowed \$2,500.00 to fight the case and that she was now applying half of her earnings on this debt. She works as a saleslady for Peck's Department Store, earning \$74.00 a month. When asked about the income from subject's business she explained that since her husband is an alien fthe Government only allows him a small allotment each week, out of which is purchased \$3.00 in War Stamps. The wife also buys this amount in stamps. She states that until we entered the war subject had sent his mother in Italy money for her support. Subject's brother, Frank, was contacted and he felt that subject's incarceration is unjust. He says that subject worked too hard to become involved in such a case, and also verified that subject had gone deeply in debt to fight the case. He states that he is helping subject's wife to pay off the \$2,500.00

which subject had borrowed to fight the case and he indicated that the Government allowed he and subject \$40.00 a week from the business they owned in common. The brother states that they were closing out one of the liquor stores which they owned and installing a novelty bar in one of the two other stores.

- 7-6-43 Subject's attorney advised him that there was an additional amount due on his 1940 income tax in the amount of \$46.90, and asked that subject be permitted to sign a Waiver of Restrictions on Assetments and collection of Deficiency in Tax. The same was signed and forwarded to the attorney on July 10, 1943.
