Gentlemen:

I am writing with reference to Otto P. Higgins, Case #55996, which case I understand comes up before your board very shortly.

I have known Otto P. Higgins since 1917, or before, and during the past ten years have seen quite a bit of him as both he and I are owners of summer cabins at Lake Lotawana not far from this city.

Both Mr. Higgins and I have been members of the Board of Directors of the Lake Lotawana Lot Owners Association, which is an association composed of the lot owners at this lake and this board meets on the average of once a month.

Naturally, on this account, I have seen during the past few years quite a bit of Mr. Higgins and believe that if he were pardoned or paroled he would become a good citizen in every respect.

Mr. Higgins has a publishing business which is being operated during his absence so if he is pardoned or paroled he will have a useful occupation on his return.

I wish to urge you to utmost consideration of this case.

I also wish to state that I am not connected with, nor have I ever been connected with any political faction, nor have I had in the past any political dealings of any nature with Mr. Higgins, but am writing this because I believe that if released Mr. Higgins would become a useful and upright citizen of his community.
