I have known Otto P, Higgins for more than twenty-five years. We attended law school together, and since then I have had opportunity to observe his conduct in the community where he resided. He has always borne a good reputation and has been highly respected by his friends and associates. Because of his standing in the community and because his license to practice law has been revoked, his punishment has been more severe than that of the usual prisoner. His wife and mother need his protection and care. He has a business here which should furnish him an adequate income on which to live.

In view of the punishment suffered and the time already served, I would respectfully suggest that this Board give consideration to granting a parole to the prisoner at this time, I remain,
