Certificate of Conditional Release

Know All Men by These Presents:

It having been made to appear to the United States Board of Parole that Otto P. Higgins, Register No. 5596-L, a prisoner now being entitled to 144 days deduction from the term of his sentence, based on commutation for good conduct as provided by Section 1 of the Act of June 21, 1902, Section 2 of the Act of February 26, 1929, and Section 8 of the Act of May 27, 1930, and Amendments thereto, is about to be released in accordance with said Act on the date as determined by the Warden or Superintendent of the said institution, and

WHEREAS, Section 4 of the Act of June 29, 1932, provides that such prisoner shall, upon release, be treated as if released on parole and shall be subject to all provisions of the law relating to the parole of United States prisoners until the expiration of the maximum term or terms specified in his sentence,

Now, THEREFORE, the United States Board of Parole, in accordance with said statute, has decided that the CONDITIONS AS SET FORTH ON THE REVERSE SIDE OF THIS BLANK shall be the conditions under which the said prisoner shall be released, and furthermore, said prisoner shall be subject to such conditions until November 2, 1941 which date will be the expiration of the maximum term or terms specified in his sentence, and

BE IT ALSO KNOWN, that this Certificate of Conditional Release does not in any way lessen the obligation of the prisoner to satisfy for payment of fine if such is part of his sentence.

BE IT ALSO KNOWN, that this Certificate of Conditional Release shall not prevent the delivery of the prisoner to authorities of the Federal Government or of any State otherwise entitled to his custody.

CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH THIS CERTIFICATE OF CONDITIONAL RELEASE IS ISSUED

The following conditions are to become operative immediately:

1. That the said person shall report his arrival at his destination at once on the Arrival Notice provided for that purpose.
2. That he shall, on the last day of each month and at such other times as may be required make a full and truthful written report, on the form prescribed, and shall submit said report to his parole Advisor, who will certify and mail it through the office of the United States Probation Officer to the Supervisor of Parole before the third day of the month following, and that when making his last monthly report previous to the date of maximum expiration as set forth on the face of this certificate, he shall make a full report of his whereabouts and behavior, which shall be considered his final report, unless specifically ordered by the Board of Parole to make a further report.
3. That he will remain within the parole limits fixed by the Board of Parole until the maximum date shown on the face of the certificate, unless permission in writing is given by the Board of Parole to change such limits. To wit:  
United States District: WESTERN DISTRICT OF MISSOURI
4. That if, when released from this institution, he is delivered into the custody of any other United States or State authority, he shall, while in the custody of said authority, send his monthly reports (bearing the attestation of the official under whose direct control his person is) to the Supervisor of Parole through the office of the United States Probation Officer in whose district he is, unless such reports are waived by the Supervisor of Parole. When released from such custody he shall go to the place designated by the Board of Parole and there remain in accordance with the conditions of this certificate.
5. That changes in residence and employment within this district will be made only after written permission therefor is given by the Probation Officer, with the approval of the Supervisor of Parole.
6. That he shall not drink intoxicating liquors, use narcotic drugs, or frequent places where either is sold, dispensed, or used unlawfully.
7. That he shall not associate with persons of bad reputation.
8. That he shall obey all laws and will report direct to his Parole Advisor, his Probation Officer, and to the Supervisor of Parole and any arrest or serious difficulty in which he becomes involved.
9. That his conduct in all respects shall be upright and honorable.
10. That he shall not enter into marriage unless and until written permission therefor has been given by the Supervisor of Parole through the United States Probation Officer.
