Due to the physical condition of the above captioned inmate it is respectfully requested that the Board of Parole interview this man in his hospital ward.

He is suffering from a serious heart condition and has had several severe coronary attacks, the most recent on October 11th, followed by several mild episodes. In this type of disease either mental or physical exertion may precipitate a fatal seizure and it is felt that he is totally incapacitated for climbing steps.

In addition to the above mentioned malady he also wears a colostomy bag which requires special attention and interferes with normal ambulation.
