In re: Morris Klein

Since 1947, Morris Klein has been interested in the following enterprises:

Mo-Kan Publishing Company, Kansas City, Missouri. This company was engaged in furnishing wire service to various book-makers relative to horse races. His partners in this enterprise were Eddie Osadchey, Thomas Lococo, and Charlie Gargotta.

Southwest Boulevard Enterprise, Kansas City, Missouri. This was a gambling venture consisting mostly of crap games and his partners in this venture were John Golding, Eddie Osadchey, Thomas Lacoco, Charlie Gargotta, Tim Moran, Julius Frelander, S. O. MacLeroy, Francis M. Lashley, and Earl Kennedy. This venture was closed in 1947 but was reopened in December, 1949 with most of above partners.

Stork Club, Council Bluffs, Iowa. This was a gambling establishment in which there were dice games, roulette, & slot machines. His partners in this venture was Charles Hutter, Eddie Osadchey, Fred Barnes, Max and Einer Abramson.

Green Hills, North Kansas City, Mo. This was a gambling venture of short duration and consisted mostly of dice games. His partners in this venture were Charles Gargotta, Thomas Lacoco, Julius Frelander and S. O. MacLeroy. (Raided)

Kay Hotel, Kansas City, Missouri. This was a gambling venture in the basement of the Kay Hotel with Eddy Osadchey. Their gambling consisted mostly of dice games.

He was in a gambling venture with Thomas Lacoco and Eddy Osadchey in the six hundred block on East Ninth which was reopened during December 1949.

Missouri Electric Construction Company, Kansas City, Missouri. This company was engaged in electrical contracting and his partners were Charlie Binaggio and Harry Young.

Ace Sales and Equipment Company. This company dealt in heavy road machinery and his partners were Charlie Binaggio and Ralph Spitkaufsky. He liquidated his holdings in this company in 1947.
