

THE FINDING OF THE KIDNAPERS' COTTAGE AND THE CONFESSION OF THE WOMAN WHO COOKED THE GANG'S MEALS CLIMAXES A DAY OF SWIFT ACTION IN THE McELROY CHASE.

1. THE HOUSE WHERE MISS McELROY WAS HELD—An electric light meter deposit found on Clarence Click, arrested as one of the Mary McElroy kidnapers, directed detectives to a sparsely populated district of Wyandotte County, Kansas, where they found the house in which Miss McElroy was held captive twenty- nine hours by her kidnapers. The house is one and one-half miles north of Shawnee, Kas., on the County Line road.

2. TWO DAYS' COOKING NETTED HER \$1,000—Lucille Cates, former wife of Walter H. McGee, arrested in Amarillo as the leader of the kidnapers, was given \$1,000 for cooking two days for Miss McElroy and the extortionist gang.

3. VAIN SEARCH FOR RANSOM MONEY—James Cashin, a Kansas City, Kansas, detective, is shown spading the ground at the rear of the house searching for the ransom money.

4. MISS MCELROY'S PRISON CELL—The basement of the house is used as a garage. Miss McElroy was held in a small section, under the front of the house. The arrow indicates the door leading to the cell where she was kept twenty-nine hours.
