Kansas City's First Professional Baseball Club
—Union Association, 1884

The Park was located in what was known as "Cook's Pasture," at 20th and Washington Street. President, A. V. McKim; Manager, E. P. (Ted) Sullivan.

PENNANT WINNERS IN KANSAS CITY

1890—The first pennant winner as a member of the Western Association Kansas City finished with a percentage of .672, winning 78 and losing 38, over Milwaukee, Minneapolis, Denver, Sioux City, Omaha, Lincoln and St. Paul.

1898—The second pennant was won in the Western League with Indianapolis, Milwaukee, St. Paul, Columbus, Detroit, Minneapolis and St. Joseph, finishing in the order named.

1901.—The Blues under Geo. Tebeau captured a third flag at old Exposition Park from the Western League crowd.

1902—The American Association was organized and the franchise taken over by Mr. Tebeau. The Western League refused to relinquish their claim to the territory and Manning, after his failure in the American League, together with Chas. A. (Kid) Nichols, took over the club and built a new park at 17th and Indiana. They also won the pennant.

1918—The race was half over when the War Department formulated the “work or fight” order and baseball suspended generally. At the close of the short season Kansas City was leading and were awarded the pennant by the league directors.
