In Re: Bluford vs. Canada, Civil Action

I am making motion to dismiss the appeal in above suit.

After the action of Mr. Canada refusing to admit Miss Bluford again February 5, 1941 in the face of the ruling of the trial judge, Judge Collet, in the above case and in spite of his clear knowledge there was no graduate work in journalism at Lincoln University for the current semester, it has been my advice to Miss Bluford that she has an independent cause of action against Mr. Canada and that the new cause of action is not open to some of the objections made to the above cause.

Since Miss Bluford cannot afford to prosecute both her appeal and the new cause of action it is my advice for her to drop the appeal.

I am writing to find if you have any taxable costs against her. if so will you please have them assessed so that we can see them paid before we file the new action.
