Dear Rubey:

Answering yours of the 31st, I agree with your suggestion that the \$65,000 appropriation be earmarked for a School of Journalism, for the reasons stated in your letter.

While we all had hoped that the the sum appropriated for new departments would be large enough to take care of Journalism and other new departments which might be needed, apparently the General Assembly will not allow more than \$65,000--and that amount is all needed for Journalism. Under the circumstances, it might as well be earmarked for that purpose, to forestall President Scruggs from spending it elsewhere.
