Dear Mr. Canada:

Enclosed find copy of the opinion of the Supreme Court in this case, filed yesterday. The opinion reaffirms the validity of race segregation, and it settles the fundamental principles (a) that a negro must make a demand on Lincoln, and (b) must give Lincoln a reasonable time to comply, before he has any right to admission at the University of Missouri.

I do not know what further action appellant will take. I will keep you advised of developments.

I assume you will pass this opinion to Dr. Middlebush and to Mr. Cowan for their information. have sent a copy of the opinion to Mr. Lathrop.
