Saturday afternoon a deputy from the United States Marshall's Office at Jefferson City served on me notice of a new suit by Miss Lucile Bluford. This suit demands damages and a permanent injunction. I enclose the summons which you will notice must be answered within twenty day. Copies have been made and sent to Mr. Hulen, Mr. Teasdale, and President Middlebush.

I have only incomplete information about the progress being made at Lincoln University in establishing graduate work in Journalism. The faculty, I understand, is organized and some at least are already on the Lincoln University campus completing plans to begin instruction at the opening of the second semester. The new Journalism building is well under way but apparently cannot be completed until March. Some of the equipment for the new building is ordered for early March delivery and installation. President Scruggs and the Business Manager are said to be pushing matters as much as possible.
