I, Eert Ubbe Iwwerks, aged 61 years, occupation Photographer, do declare on oath that my personal description is: Color White, complexion Fair, height 5 feet 6½ inches, weight 134 pounds, color of hair Gray, color eyes Brown[,] other visible distinctive marks None[.] I was born in Uttum, Germany on the 29th day of June, anno Domini 1855; I now reside at 2336 Hardesty, Kansas City, Missouri (Give number, street, city or town, and State.) I emigrated to the United States of America from Bremen, Germany on the vessel Mary Magdalena (If the alien arrived otherwise than by vessel, the character of conveyance or name of transportation company should be given.); my last foreign residence was Uttum, Germany; I am – married; the name of my wife is Laura; she was born at Harlam, Missouri and now resides at Kansas City, Missouri[.] It is my bona fide intention to renounce forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, sovereignty, and particularly to William II German Emperor, of whom I am now a subject; I arrived at the port of New York, in the State of New York, on or about the 9th day of April, anno Domini 1869; I am not an anarchist; I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy; and it is my intention in good faith to become a citizen of the United States of America and to permanently reside therein: SO HELP ME GOD.

United States of America Petition for Naturalization

To the Honorable the District Court of the United States at Kansas City, Mo.

The petition of Ert Ubbe Iwwerks hereby filed, respectfully showeth:

First. My place of residence is 3118 Holmes St., Kansas City, Mo. 2601 Holmes

Second. My occupation is Photographer

Third. I was born on the 29 day of June, anno Domini 1855, at Uttum, Germany

Fourth. I emigrated to the United States from Bremen, Germany, on or about the 5th day of March anno Domini 1869, and arrived in the United States, at the port of New York N.Y., on the 9th day of April anno Domini 1869, on the vessel Mary Magdalena

Fifth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 27 day of march, anno Domini 1917 at Kansas City, MO., in the District Court of the United States

Sixth. I am – married. My wife's name is Laura; she was born on the 25 day of July, anno Domini 1874 at Harlam, Mo., and now resides at 3118 Holmes St., Kansas City Mo. I have one children, and the name date and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows:

Ubbe born at Kansas City, Mo. March 24, 1901 and now resides at Kansas City Mo.

Seventh. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to Germany, or any independent State with the bounds of the former German Empire of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Eighth. I am able to speak the English language.

Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 9 day of April, anno Domini 1869, and in the State of Missouri, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 3rd day of September, anno Domini 1919, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. ~~(I made petition for citizenship to the __ Court of __ at __, on the __ day of __ anno Domini 1__, and the said petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit __, and the cause of such denial has since been cured or removed.~~

Attached hereto and made a part of this petition are my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Labor, together with my affidavit and the affidavits of the two verifying witnesses thereto, required by law. Wherefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.
