ORDER FOR DESTRUCTION OF CONTRABAND PROPERTY

Now on this 31st day of May, 1932, it appearing to the Court that the defendants in the above entitled cause, and each of them, have been duly convicted in this court for the crime and offense of conspiracy to violate the National Prohibition Act and it further appearing to the court that at the time of the arrest of said defendants there was seized by agents of the Bureau of Prohibition and held as evidence certain articles, preparations, Benedictine, Oil of Juniper, Creme de Mint, whiskey, gin and alcohol, intended by the defendants then and there for use in the unlawful sale and rectification of intoxicating liquor and the court further finding that the said property which is hereinafter set forth, was duly and lawfully seized by officers of the United States government is now in the custody of Harvey L. Duncan, Acting Special Agent in Charge, Bureau of Prohibition.

The court further finding that the prosecution of this cause has now been terminated and that there is no further use for retention and holding of said articles, preparations, Benedictine, Oil of Juniper, Creme de Mint, whiskey, gin and alcohol, it is therefore,

ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the following articles and things, towit:

- 10 pints Knickerbocker whiskey
- 4 gallons Scotch whiskey
- 2 forty-ounce bottles White Heather whiskey
- 2 bottles High and Dry Gin
- 1 part bottle Benedictine
- 6 bottles High and Dry Gin
- 10 pints of Old Tucker

- 2 bottles Creme de Mint
- 1 pint bottle half full alcohol
- 2 ounces Oil of Juniper
- 1 gallon can a quarter full of gin
- 10 one-gallon cans alcohol
- 31 quarter pint bottles containing samples of alcohol

be, and the same are hereby ordered destroyed.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED THAT the said Harvey L. Duncan be, and he is hereby designated as the proper officer to destroy said articles and things.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the said Harvey L. Duncan proceed to forthwith destroy said articles and things and that upon the destruction of the same the said Harvey L. Duncan is hereby ordered to make return on the back of this order stating that said property, articles and things have been destroyed and rendered useless in obedience to this order.
