White, 54; Wells Revised Alpha, Form 5; surpasses 72 per cent of the inmate population. Binet Equiv. M.A. 15:9, I.Q. 99 - a very good performance. Surpasses 64 per cent in his voluntary motor output - tapping test - a very good performance surpasses 67 per cent in accuracy on the manipulative dexterirt test - Ferguson Form Board, No. 3 - a very good performance. Consistently commendable cilnical output. (Percentiles based on inmate standardization.)

Neurological examination shows: Moderately lively /knee jerks.

This is a slender, fairly well developed and nourished, middle aged, white male, who states that he is in good physical health. Asserts that he has had no law difficulty previous to the present situation and the available records do not refute this statement. He is now confined in this institution for having violated the voting laws in connection with the Vote Fraud Scandal of Kansas City in 1936. Claims that he has been occupationally engaged as a laborer and salesman.

This man reports only six years of school training and contributes the curtailment of his educational advantages to the death of his mother when he was only six years of age. Says that he was forced by economic conditions to quit school at the age of thirteen. He is fairly alert, responds to interrogation readily giving a relevant and coherent account of the events of his past life. His attitude appears to be good and he should be able to get along well here and make a good adjustment. There are no psychotic symptoms.
