Lear Governor Stark

May I supplement my letter of yesterday applying for the appointment of Circuit Judge, 21st., Judicial Circuit by submitting some additional reasons why I am so eagerly hoping for your favorable consideration.

When campaigning against Judge Dearing in 1934, success seemed so assured that I spent more than I was justified and very shortly thereafter my little boy dropped the little girl seriously injuring her and subsequent thereto she has been partially paralyzed. I feel that the appointment would provide sufficient funds to have a bone specialist save her from being a cripple for life. About six months thereafter my aged father was compelled to submit to two major operations incurring in excess of \$500.00 additional debt. To be candid Governor the appointment would mean much, not only to myself but my family as well and having been Judges only Democratic opponent I feel that the circumstances considered I am entitled to it and if you agree I can assure you that you will never have cause to regret having made the appointment. I shall divert every effort to repaying you many many times and shall be on duty twenty four hours each day eagerly awaiting an opportunity to reciprocate.

Should I receive the coveted appointment I shall immediately make a reconnoitering trip thru the five counties of this Circuit, sound out sentiment as pertains to Judge Douglas and will spend practically all my time in various counties recruiting votes for him until August 2nd. I will guarantee a very creditable showing in six counties. Neither Judge Douglas nor yourself will be under any obligation to me whatsoever for this service. It will be voluntarily done on my part.
