My dear Prof. Spalding:

Thank you so much for your letter of congratulations. You may be assured that I am deeply gratified at the almost unanimous support I have received from the Democratic Party in the different counties, and the solid backing of both the St. Louis and Kansas City Democracy.

Many of my friends, who are more experienced in politics than I, have suggested that we defer the organization of Stark-for-Governor Clubs until a later date, for the reason that the primary election is still a long way off and the campaign might drag, if started too soon.
