Dear Sir: -

I am here in Kansas City, Mo. for a few days, have been to Liberty, Mo., and met with both clubs of negroes here and in Liberty, Mo. I am very sorry I was not selected or accepted by your or your committee's chairmans to work for you interest in your campaign. I could have done you alots of good Mr. Starks.

My law school is out, but now I will return to Topeka, Kans. to work there since you do not need my services. I do hope you success and would have been very glad to have started work among the negroes in this section for you. I have had alots of experience in politics and there are many things I see now

that could be done here among the negroes to your interest. D.W. Wilhite a lawyer here; who was elected Pres. of Democratic group of Missouri is my associate and best friend. Really I could have been of great service to you, he is a Negro also.
