Dear Sir:-

Your office has been previously notified concerning conditions here regarding the Primary Election held on Mar. 6th. Notice was sent your office that violence and fraud on a large scale was practiced here by the invisible government of the Thomas J. Pendergast machine. I doubt not that many of the best citizens of Kansas City Mo are wondering what (if anything) your office will do to place your moral support on the side of justice and peace in the election that will take place on March 27th. I feel that the very least that your office can do, honorably, is to issue a public statement to be published by any and all of the newspapers here or elsewhere setting forth your purpose to extend no favoritism to the invisible government that has misruled Kansas City, Mo., for several years. Also, I feel that a statement should be issued from your office clearly setting forth that you will in no wise condone false registrations (concerning which numerous frauds have been discovered), vote-repeating, violence and bloodshed. Your office should also openly oppose misconduct on the part of Kansas City Mo policemen who discriminate against workers for the Citizens Ticket and show favoritism toward workers for the Pendergast Machine Ticket, which calls itself the Democratic Party of Kansas City Mo. (a vicious misnomer).
