A COUNTRY BOY FOR SENATE

Judge Harry S. Truman of Independence, is distinctively a product of the country. He was born and reared between the plow handles on a Jackson county farm, where he lived until the World War. He went to France as a captain of Field Artillery with the Missouri and Kansas troops, and now is a Colonel in the Field Artillery Reserve.

For 10 years, he served as judge of Jackson county, 8 years as presiding judge, spending 55 million dollars without a single smell of graft. He is the father of the Jackson county road system, the finest in the United States.

In October, 1933, he was appointed Federal re-employment director for Missouri, resigning when he filed for the Senate. He is a member of the American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars, the Baptist church, is married and has one child.
