Preliminary but fairly comprehensive survey of seventy three rural counties having largest Democratic vote indicate Milligans support more than sufficient to insure his nomination over Cochran and Truman Stop Reaction in rural Missouri to Trumans candidacy decided unfavorable and impression is general that he will run third in race with Cochran and Milligan and that long before primary his friends will become convinced of futility of his candidacy. Stop. If I should file for Senate and conditions should subsequently demonstrate impossibility of Trumans nomination he should withdraw what in your opinion would be the attitude of Kansas City Democracy toward my candidacy. Stop. Under conditions stated would Kansas City Democracy support Milligan Cochran or Lozier. Stop. I am convinced a very substantial majority of rural Democrats will support me if I run.
