"Supplementing telegram April eleventh, regarding possibility closing Bureau Foreign and Domestic Commerce office Kansas City. Understand matter now in hands of committee on appropriation for State, Commerce and Labor. Departments dollars and cents results, reported fiscal year thirty and thirty-one, indicate Kansas City ranking eleventh among a total of thirty-four such offices reported, indicating the importance of this office and the necessity of its continuance. Earnestly request that due consideration be given to this and other facts regarding the Kansas City office, which have been laid before you."
