Dear Clarence:

I have not been home since Wednesday morning, but your message has been forwarded to me.

I have felt out the situation in the Kansas City area where the Park sentiment predominates, although there is quite a lot of sentiment for Major Stark in the outlying territory. I think Mr. Stark would make an ideal candidate under the present conditions.

I talked with Mr. Pendergast and he at Park, Stark or Ragland would be satisfactory to him and moreover, he did not limit the field to these three men. He said any other good man would be acceptable to him that would be acceptable to the party.

I had hoped to see you here today, but I presume you will be in Jefferson City Monday. I think I will be there Sunday afternoon and Monday forenoon as I am billed to speak at Unionville Monday night. I will try and see the second district committeemen and committeewomen and report conditions Monday.
