sent out by the New Deal on the Supreme Court. The propaganda is all the other way, as it always has been; in the last campaign and all the campaigns before it.

The newspapers as you know have always been controlled by the interests diametrically opposed to the individual, and any propaganda sent out by the employees of the Government would not be a drop in the bucket.

I am sorry to disabuse your mind about standing by the flag, but I expect to stand by the flag and still vote to put a little new blood in the Supreme Court because I think that is all it needs.
