Thursday Night

I am going to Columbia in the morning as Truman is officially opening his campaign there tomorrow night. There is also a meeting of the State Committee there Saturday night so I will have to stay over tomorrow night.

Starting the first of the week I will probably be gone from here a couple of days at a time. If I do I will have Mrs. Woods look after Ginger. Every night when I come home Ginger looks all around the car and in all my pockets trying to find Kanky and Mary.

I got your card from Olney and a letter from you and Kanky which were written at Frankfort. Also your telegram telling of your safe arrival which I was very glad to get.

I talked to Mary Ellen over the phone Tuesday evening and everything is all right over there. Joe is working for the Park Board helping Cot Tierney. Cot has charge of the upkeep of the public baseball diamonds.

Mother received a card from John which was written the day they laid over in Milwaukee.

It has been terribly hot here this week. It was 104 yesterday and 102 today. However there, seems to be a storm coming up tonight so maybe we will get some rain.

If you run short of money let me know and I will sen you some more.
