Dear Senator:-

I am well aware you can't ride a good horse to death and you have been very kind to me in the little I have to offer in return. However the situation I mentioned to you in Kansas City last week apparently is at a standstill. I called Jimmie Saturday, but he had gone out of the city and will not return until Wednesday. The word I had from Jimmie was that he was sorry my father was cut off, that he had been a good worker on the job and also in the precinct and that whoever dropped him off did not know the organization lineup."

Although Judge George, Mr. Thompson, the highway engineer, Joe Gallucci and one or two others keep telling my father they are going to do something for him, I think he is beginning to feel rather restless about the situation.

Judge George said he was awaiting word from Pendergast. All are very friendly and say they do not know why he was cut off.

If you know any way to some action in the case I'd certainly appreciate it.

If he has to be out I know it would be some salve to his feelings if they would tell him just what the trouble is. He made a lot of friends at the courthouse and they all express surprise that he is out.
