Dear Senator:

I was glad to receive your telegram and letter but frankly believe that Lou Holland is giving us the run around.

We do not see where the city has or is going to get the money for two airports and it is our thought that he is certainly pushing the Greenwood site and is only keeping the Grandview site in the picture to try and quite us and the Kansas City Southern.

We very definately asked him a half-a- dozen times if both sites were recommended and figured in the W. P. A. grant and at all time he advoided answering. We do know that until last Saturday, as far as he was concerned, we were completely out of the picture. We believe from this end we have Accomplished a great deal with Ward Gifford and through Ward with the consul committee. We do know cofidentaly from Ward that when Lou Holland left here he was still pulling for the Greenwood site and only put the Grandview site back in the picture on account of some land trouble at the other site.

When I say we, I am refering to Garrett Murry, Russell Mullens and myself, as we have been working practically all of the time since Ward called on us Saturday.

I certainly hope that you can and will continue to help us at Grandview but have Grandview the number one and if they have to have another port let Greenwood be

number two.

I am writing this letter with the advice and consul of Russell and Garrett.
